- Delivering time-limited mental wellness and life skill supports including psycho-education, coaching, and follow up;
- Facilitating client skill development in areas such as self-esteem, mental well-being, communication and positive coping strategies (1:1 or group format);
- Advocating and facilitating referrals to community resources and supportive services;
- Diligently monitoring, recording and reporting changes in clinical presentation;
- Ensure health and safety measures in the workplace including pandemic (COVID) screening, infection prevention and control practices are adhered to.

Qualifications:

- Undergraduate or Masters degree of Social Work, Psychology or Behavioral Science;
- A member of the Ontario College of Social Workers & Social Service Workers or other regulatory college;
- Minimal 2 years recent mental health sector experience preferably within a community based or out-patient setting;
- Excellent short term counselling, crisis intervention and group facilitation skills with competency in the areas of depression, trauma and substance abuse;
- Excellent knowledge of community resources to foster referrals and service linkage;
- Demonstrated knowledge of the principals of health equity, the social determinants of health and client advocacy;
