The Glengarry Nurse Practitioner-Led Clinic (GNPLC) is one of 26 innovative non-profit provincial clinics that enables Nurse Practitioners, Registered Nurses and a interdisciplinary team of health professionals to work to their full scope of practice and deliver the highest quality of primary health care that is both client centered and outcome orientated.

As part of our regional expansion, we are currently recruiting a dedicated **Registered Nurse**.

- 35 hours per week salary range (39.08 to 40.34/ hour)
- Current schedule Mon. thru Fri. 0830-1600 hours, with one flexed day 1300-1930 hours serving our evening hours.
- Including HOOPP pension plan, a wellness spending account and other benefits.

Key Areas of Responsibility and Duties include:

- Providing primary care health assessment, diagnostic and customized treatment planning within the RN scope of practice and best practice guidelines.
- Performing venipuncture and point of care testing (urine / HCG /Rapid Strep Throat) as required and directed under the RN(EC) and in adherence to infection control standards.
- Conducting well baby checks, administering immunizations and performing acuity triage to support appointment prioritization.
- Supporting clients in their understanding and management of chronic disease(s) using evidence based resources and practices (e.g diabetes , hypertension etc.).
- Collaborating with inter-professional team members to devise and implement customized care plans based on best practices.
- Delivering health teaching and coaching on disease prevention and healthy lifestyle practices such as safe medication use, physical activity, smoking cessation and mental wellness.
- Documenting client care activities concisely and accurately according to guidelines and care standards.
- Facilitating clients access to community resources and supports by way of referral and advocacy.

Qualifications:

- University degree or college diploma in Nursing from an accredited university or college.
- Current member in good standing with the College of Nurses of Ontario.
- At least 2 years practical nursing care experience within a community health/ public health or acute care setting.
- Demonstrated skills in health coaching and chronic disease management (COPD; Hypertension; DM etc).
- Experience developing and facilitating group health education events.
- Proficiency in the use of electronic charting.
- Committed to implementing comprehensive client care practices within a client centered and continuous quality improvement framework.
- English proficiency is required and a proficiency in French is an asset.
