- Perform venipuncture and point-of-care testing (e.g., urinalysis, HCG, rapid strep testing, etc.) as required and under the direction of the RN(EC), ensuring adherence to infection prevention and control standards.
- Conduct well-baby assessments, administer immunizations, and perform triage to support appropriate prioritization of client appointments.
- Support clients in understanding and managing chronic conditions (e.g., diabetes, hypertension) using evidence-based approaches.
- Collaborate with interdisciplinary team members to develop and implement individualized care plans aligned with best practices.
- Provide health education and coaching focused on disease prevention and healthy lifestyle choices, including cardiovascular health, medication safety, physical activity, and mental wellness.
- Maintain accurate, timely, and concise documentation of client care in accordance with organizational policies and professional standards.
- Facilitate access to community resources and services through referrals, advocacy, and system navigation support.
